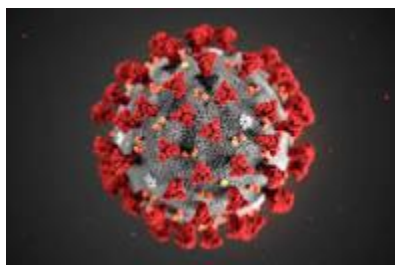

A Holiday of Irving's Masterpieces—Historical Markers

Irving is a place rich with history. Many of the locations have been noted with historical markers. The Irving Heritage Society's holiday tree features those historical markers. The forty nine postcard size ornaments feature each of the markers at their present day sites.

You can see some of Irving's Masterpieces when you find the Ruth Paine House, the Caldwell House, the Heritage House, the Otis Brown House, the Caster Cabin, the Joffre-Gilbert House, Kit Cemetery, Sowers Cemetery, the Irving public library, the Dallas County Irving Fresh Water Supply District, MacArthur Pump Station, etc. Which markers interest you?

The hanging ornaments feature the logos of the three different types of markers: the Texas Historical Commission, the Irving Heritage Society, and Irving Texas Centennial. Each group has its specific criteria to be met before designating a marker. Are there other spots in Irving which should be recognized? Let the Heritage Society know of any of those.

The featured ornaments were constructed by Irving Heritage Society members. The photographer of the markers with their locations is Gary Schepf. A special thank you goes to him for allowing the Irving Heritage Society to use his photos.
